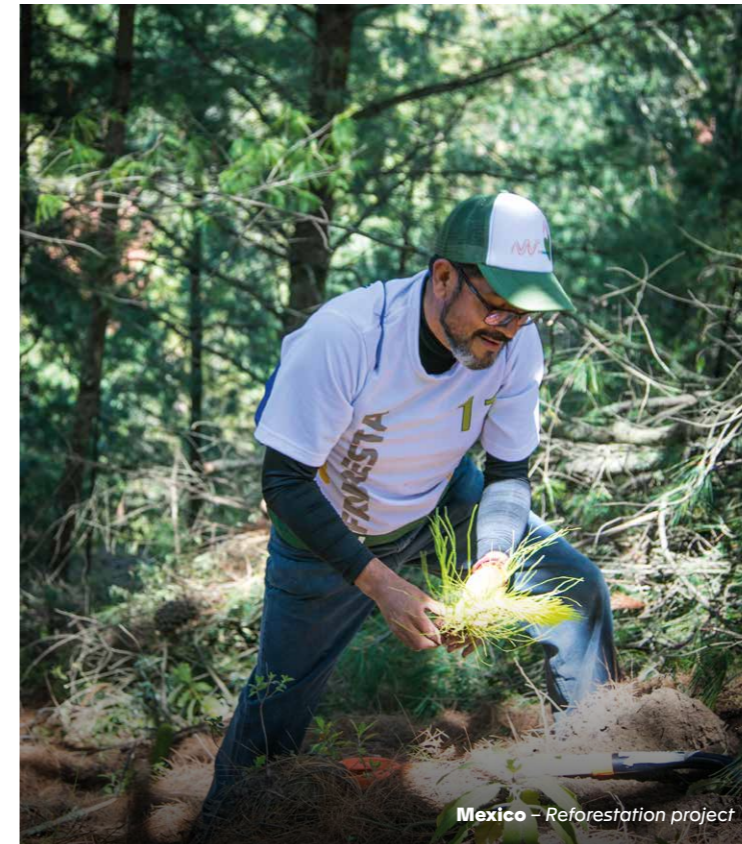

2023 Call for solidarity projects

Each year since its creation, the FORVIA Foundation has fostered employee solidarity through its annual Solidarity Call for projects. To date, 60 employee-driven initiatives have been funded. In its fourth successful year, the 2023 call spanned all **300** international company sites and was translated into ten languages.

In 2023, **26** new projects were selected. Altogether, employees' impactful projects received over **€1,130,000** from the Foundation last year. Implemented alongside non-profit partners, these employee-driven projects will positively impact the lives of over **2,000** people across **11** countries.

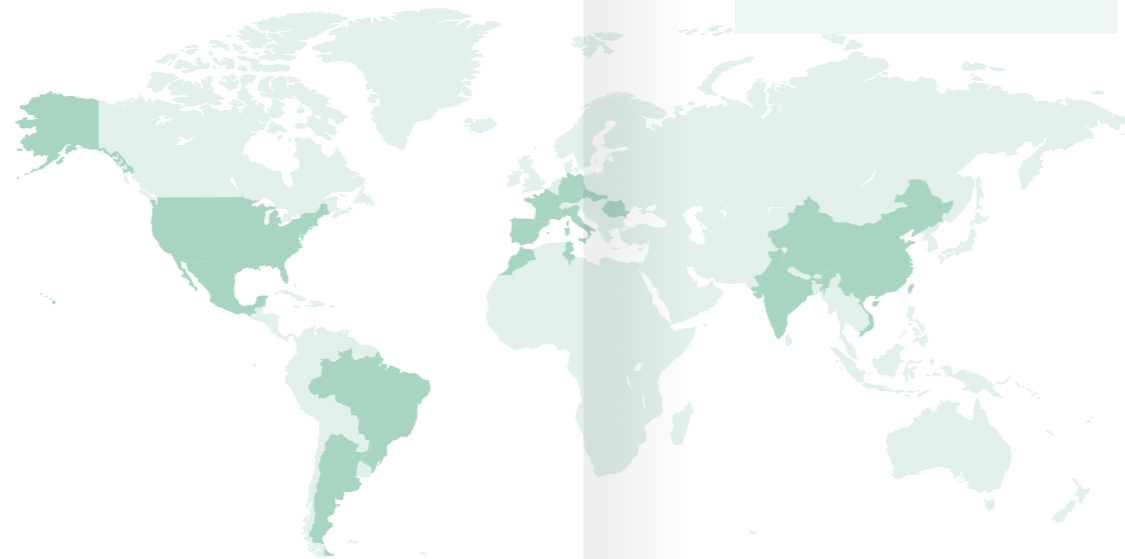

"In 2006, I spent a transformative 6 months volunteering as an activity leader with L'enfant@l'hôpital, a French non-profit dedicated to improving the lives of hospitalized or disabled young people. This experience left a lasting impact on me.

L'enfant@l'hôpital runs a unique program called Kolibri, which connects hospitalized children with travelers worldwide. Through the Kolibri app, children build meaningful connections with these travelers, meeting them virtually before their trips and receiving weekly updates on their adventures. This program fosters a sense of connection and joy for children facing challenging circumstances.

The Solidarity Pioneers incubation program propels employee social impact to new heights.

Launched in June 2023, this ambitious initiative equips selected teams with the time, training and resources needed to lead groundbreaking solidarity projects.

The program is aimed at employees who have an idea for a project that will eventually become financially self-sufficient, requires substantial resources to start up, and can significantly increase the Group's social and environmental impact.

A call for Solidarity Pioneers projects is held every two years. The winning teams receive a comprehensive support package including:

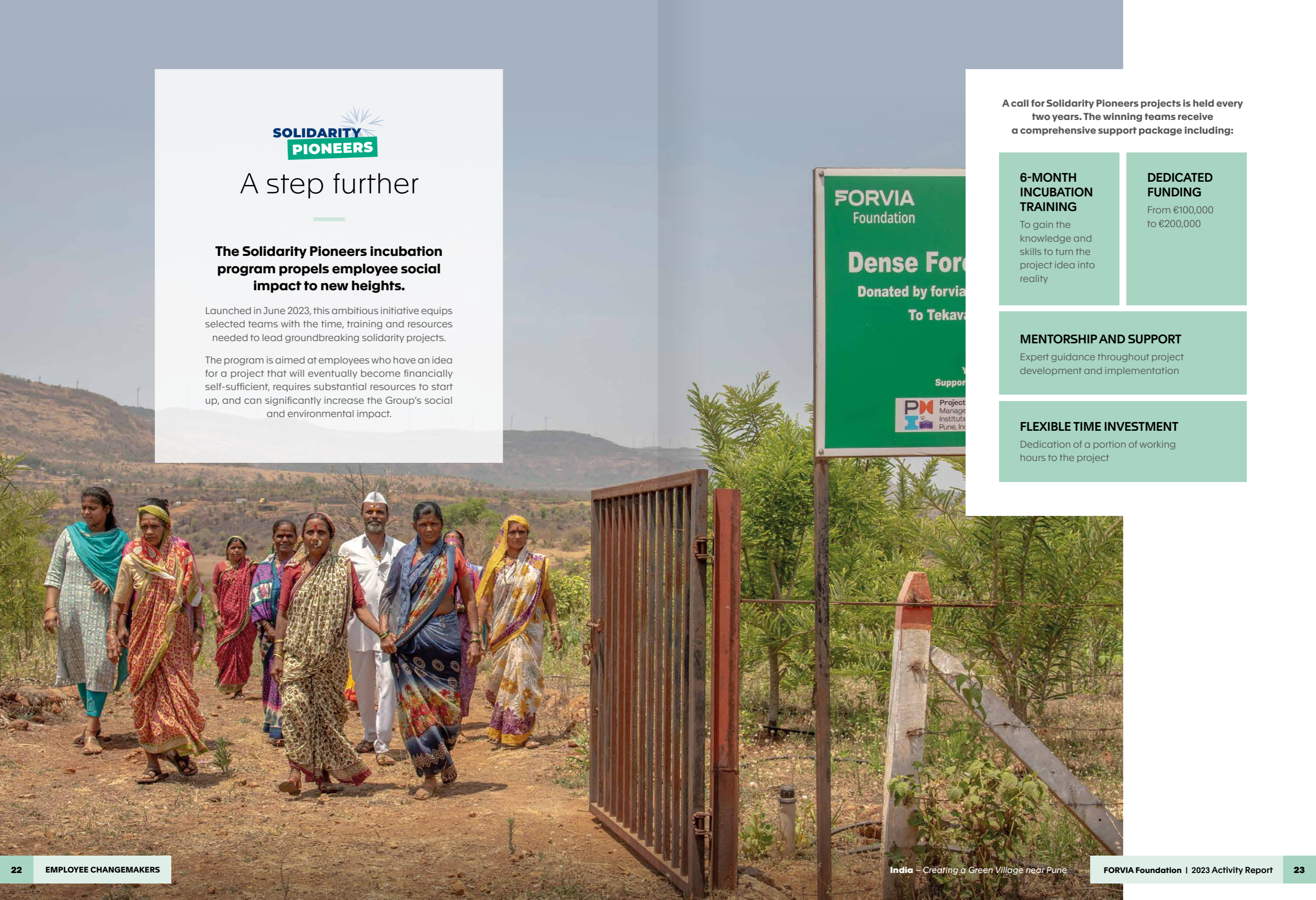

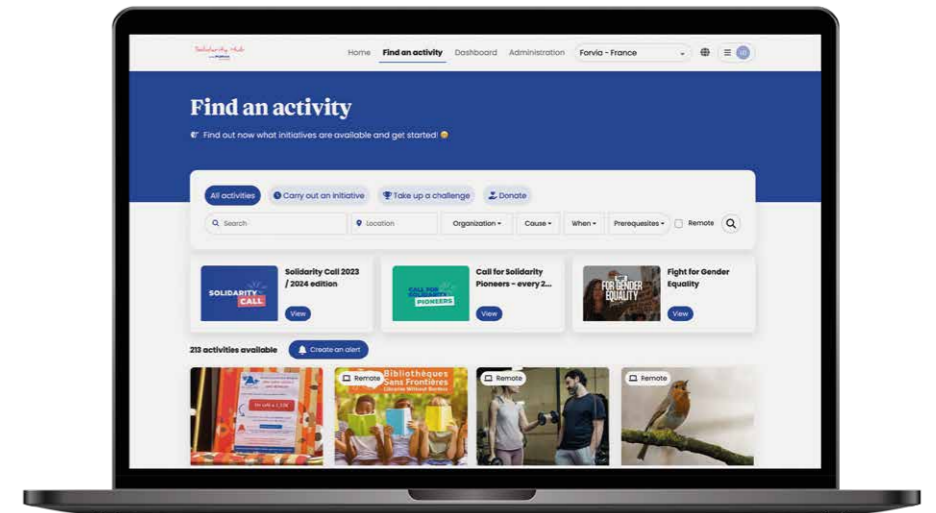

Amplifying positive impact

The FORVIA Foundation believes in the power of collaboration. By strategically partnering with non-profit experts, we can maximize our social impact. In 2023, a significant investment of €1,410,000 was directed towards projects run by or developed in partnership with these leading organizations.

Protecting our oceans, as a key climate ally: the FORVIA Foundation's new initiatives

In 2023, we joined forces with two leading organizations to target critical ocean challenges:

- Educating the next generation on the importance of protecting marine biodiversity with the Maud Fontenoy Foundation
- Addressing marine plastic pollution and developing sustainable industrial applications in partnership with Plastic Odyssey

These partnerships will help to raise awareness about protecting the oceans, which are the planet's main reservoir of biodiversity and a key ally in the fight against climate change.





PLASTIC ODYSSEY

Reducing plastic pollution in the oceans and turning it into a resource with Plastic Odyssey

Plastic Odyssey's mission is to combat plastic pollution by promoting the circular economy through various initiatives. These include:

- Education on plastic pollution in coastal areas, the source of over 75% of ocean plastic waste
- Awareness of recycling through professional networks
- Developing entrepreneurship in waste recovery and transformation

Through its partnership with the FORVIA Foundation, Plastic Odyssey will be able to accelerate its activities while benefiting from FORVIA's technological and scientific expertise to optimize the quality of recycled materials derived from ocean-bound plastic (OBP).

Since September 2023, Plastic Odyssey has been collaborating with MATERI'ACT, the sustainable materials subsidiary of FORVIA. The collaboration seeks to transform plastic waste from the ocean – or collected before being dumped in the ocean – into valuable materials for the automotive industry.



A car interior made partly from ocean-bound plastics

Following a nine-month collaboration with Plastic Odyssey, FORVIA presented a significant achievement in 2024: **the creation of a sustainable car interior featuring recycled ocean-bound plastics.** This innovative project was conceived by MATERI'ACT, FORVIA's dedicated sustainable materials branch.

- This project proves ocean-bound plastics can be recycled responsibly and reintroduced into a high-value industry and a closed-loop system.
- Using ocean-bound plastics for doors and instrument panels can reduce the CO₂ footprint of these car parts by 20%.
- Leveraging MATERI'ACT's expertise to transform complex waste into a valuable resource.



Educating young people to protect and preserve marine biodiversity with the Maud Fontenoy Foundation

The Maud Fontenoy Foundation is a French non-profit organization guided by the motto 'Oceans are humanity's future.' It carries out environmental education actions aimed at the general public – in particular young people – to raise awareness about the importance of the oceans.

Through the partnership with FORVIA, the Maud Fontenoy Foundation is expanding its reach in educating future generations on the critical importance of protecting marine ecosystems. The partnership will help to support over 150 sea school programs, making ocean conservation accessible to underprivileged children.

Climate & Biodiversity Awards to promote scientific research & ocean solutions



Launched in November 2023, the objective of these awards is to **support student researchers tackling critical ocean conservation challenges.** This initiative focuses on supporting the research and development of solutions directly inspired by the marine environment. The winning projects will be announced in June 2024 and will receive a €50,000 grant (awarded to the institute overseeing the research) to further develop their innovative ideas.

Four award categories:

- Innovative solutions for industrial water treatment and microplastic reduction
- Biomimicry and materials inspired by marine life
- Decarbonizing the economy through ocean biotechnology
- Ocean & innovation solutions

Environment



Giving medical equipment a second life with Envie Autonomie

Since 2021, the FORVIA Foundation has partnered with Envie Autonomie, a French organization that refurbishes medical equipment, to empower mobility for people with disabilities. The Foundation supported the launch of two new sites and, alongside the Accenture Foundation, provided expertise to help the non-profit optimize their approach in spare parts management, logistics and environmental impact.



Supporting actions that promote biodiversity and protect ecosystems with Noé

The FORVIA Foundation supports the *Les Prairies de Noé* program, a French initiative focused on wild pollinator conservation. In collaboration with Noé, in 2023 the Foundation launched a project to restore pollinator habitats at key FORVIA sites in Caligny and Nanterre in France. The initiative focuses on natural area restoration, sustainable green space management and employee awareness.

Culture



Combining culture and inclusion with the Théâtre des Amandiers in Nanterre

The Théâtre Nanterre-Amandiers, a national dramatic center, places strong emphasis on nurturing the young artists who will shape the future of theater. The FORVIA Foundation contributes to the *La Belle Troupe des Amandiers* program, a two-year intensive acting course for 12 promising drama students, fostering both cultural exchange and artistic inclusion. By encouraging the young artists to perform their own creations throughout Nanterre and the Greater Paris region, the program ensures that theater reaches new audiences and breaks down barriers.

Education



Providing educational and social connections for 'street children' with Mobile School

The FORVIA Foundation supports three mobile schools that organize regular visits to disadvantaged neighborhoods in Mexico and Romania, providing an educational and social connection for 'street children.' In 2023, the Foundation supported the opening of a new mobile school in South Africa.



Supporting young digital workers and improving the prospects of those with little or no qualifications to find digital jobs with Simplon

The FORVIA Foundation funds the Simplon Foundation's program 'Bac(k) on track', an intensive learning program for people with few or no qualifications that helps prepare them before they resume their studies, as well as offering emergency scholarships for the most vulnerable students.



In 2024, a new partner for education: preventing school dropout in vocational schools with C'Possible

Equipping young people with job-ready skills is critical for their success, and ultimately benefits both businesses and society. Recognizing this, the Foundation has joined forces with C'Possible, a French non-profit supporting students in vocational schools. This partnership aims to empower students, guide them on their career paths, and connect them with potential employers, ultimately helping to prevent school dropout.

FORVIA employees will actively contribute by:

- Mentoring students to offer personalized support
- Facilitating industry-focused workshops
- Hosting open days at FORVIA sites, showcasing daily operations
- Supporting skills development initiatives

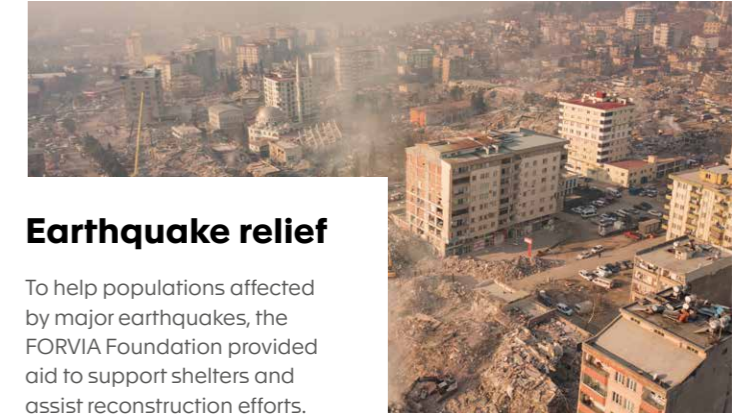
COVID-19 pandemic
