A new chapter opens for the Foundation

This year marks the third anniversary of the FORVIA Foundation, and we are incredibly proud of what we have been able to accomplish with the commitment and dedication of FORVIA teams. Looking forward, we will be able to make an even stronger impact for the environment and for our communities as we on board new employees solidarity projects, launch a new program and concluded 2 new partnerships.

Our fourth call for solidarity projects since the Foundation started proved a real success, with innovative and increasingly mature ideas submitted by employees. Choosing between them was challenging, but we have selected 26 new initiatives to support, bringing the total to 60 employee-led projects helping 6,000 beneficiaries in 17 countries and involving more than 200 volunteers.

The enthusiasm of our teams to make a difference has inspired us to **develop** a new pilot program that will be launched in June : Solidarity Pioneers. This program aims to incubate major solidarity projects, giving employees the means and the time to develop ambitious, impactful initiatives with a team and a significant budget. This new program will allow us to unleash the solidarity potential of our employees and turn the urge to act into meaningful action on an even bigger scale.

Lastly, we have joined forces with two new partners – the

Maud Fontenoy Foundation and Plastic Odyssey – with a focus on education and the conservation of marine biodiversity. In line with the Group's sustainability, environmental and biodiversity commitments, with these partners we will help tackle plastic pollution and raise awareness about marine biodiversity in order to safeguard the oceans. so critical to the health of the planet, and our best ally in the fight against climate change.

2023 winning projects

26 employee-led solidarity projects selected

The FORVIA Foundation's fourth call for projects, which was rolled out internationally across our 300 sites and translated into nine languages, received a total of 128 ideas submitted by employees. Out of the 26 projects selected :

54% aim at advancing education 23% focus on protecting the environment 23% provide support to improve mobility

The Foundation will dedicate $\epsilon 1 M$ to sponsor these initiatives

+ 2,000 people will benefit from these projects in 11 countries

For example, the NGO runs a program that connects them with travelers all around the globe, who use an app called Kolibri to build a connection with them, meeting them before their trip and posting weekly reports on their adventures. I spent 6 months in 2006 as an activity leader working full time for this NGO in many areas in France and in various hospital departments . This experience left its mark on me. I am very pleased that the FORVIA Foundation is helping me support these types of activities. This funding will allow 113 children in 8 schools in France to be visited regularly.

Partnership with the Maud Fontenoy Foundation



THE PARTNER : French non-profit whose motto is "Saving the ocean is saving humanity"

ITS MISSION: To carry out environmental education actions to inform the general public and in particular young people about the importance of the oceans.



KEY PEOPLE : Maud Fontenoy is a sailor, sustainable development expert and ambassador for the French Ministry of Education.

OUR SUPPORT: The FORVIA Foundation will support 2 programs

- Education on the marine environment, the donation will support school trips to and about the sea for disadvantaged students.
- Innovation on marine solutions for industry, we will also support a scientific prize to award innovation on marine solutions.



Why do oceans matter?

70% of the Earth's surface is oceans

#1 source of fresh water supply is from ocean evaporation

50% of the oxygen we breathe comes from the ocean

90% of the excess heat caused by greenhouse gases is absorbed by the oceans

30% of CO₂ from human activities is absorbed by the oceans





A whale captures on average 33 tons of CO₂/year of CO₂/ year

1 hectare of mangroves can absorb 1.5 tons

A tree stores 22 kg of CO₂/year

Plastic recycling

Partnership with Plastic Odyssey

THE PARTNER: A collective of actors committed to reducing plastic pollution in the ocean. It refurbished an oceanographic research vessel that can transform plastic waste into fuel. In October 2022, the ship set off on a 3-year mission to offer its open-source recycling technology platform to the countries most affected by plastic pollution.

ITS MISSION: To make plastic waste recovery solutions accessible around the world, developing local recycling economies & creating jobs by focusing on developing countries. With more than 30 stopovers, the Plastic Odyssey aims to develop a global network of local initiatives to take action on land before plastic waste is dumped into the ocean.



KEY PEOPLE: Simon Bernard is a merchant navy officer and CEO of Plastic Odyssey

OUR SUPPORT: The FORVIA Foundation is supporting the project in 2 ways:

Facts about plastic pollution

80% of marine pollution is plastic waste

200 *M* tons of plastic waste has been dumped into the oceans since 1950

15 *M* tons of plastic waste end up in the oceans each year

The **7th continent** is the Great Pacific Garbage Patch which is three times the size of France, and contains mor microparticules than elsewhere

7% of annual plastic pollution comes from rivers

12% of annual pollution comes from maritime activities (industrial fishing, transport)



of annual pollution is generated by the activities of coastal populations (-50 km from the sea)
